Internship Components

Eligible Experiences - The internship opportunity identified by a Golden LEAF Scholar must be aligned with the student's course of study. Course of study is defined as a declared major or intended major for first-year students that have not yet declared a major. For students without a declared major, additional information regarding courses taken or registered to take may be requested to confirm course of study.

Eligible Sites - Internship sites include, but are not limited to, businesses, non-profits, governmental entities, and/or companies. Internships must be completed in person at a site physically located in a qualifying rural county (see link to qualifying counties). Internships may be completed at an entity with multiple locations including with locations outside of the eligible counties, provided the student completes the internship at a site located in an eligible county.

Interns are responsible for: contacting their prospective internship site: discussing the internship opportunity with the site; working with the site to craft a job description for their internship; and providing the contact information for the internship site on their application.

While the Golden LEAF Rural Internship Initiative aims to provide its participating scholars with valuable work experiences, there are guidelines for activities scholars may engage in within Bioscience, Clinical, Health, and Medical (BCHM) settings. You can review a list of pre-approved BCHM positions here.

Application Information

Applications must include an unofficial transcript (to verify course of study information), initial internship site information (site name, contact, and contact email), and a series of answers to short essay questions.
